

Process for Organizational Account Creation and Request for Public Assistance (RPA) in Grants Portal

This Quick Guide provides the steps an Applicant must take to create a Grants Portal user account and submit an RPA.

- Potential Applicants interested in participation in the Public Assistance Program should initiate the process by reaching out to their Local Emergency Management Department or State Emergency Management representative.**
 - Upon receipt of interest from an organization, the Recipient (State) will reach out to the potential Applicant to obtain the following information:**
 - Applicant Name*
 - County*
 - FEMA PA Code*
 - EIN Number*
 - DUNS Number*
 - Org Type*
 - Primary/Alternate Contact (Name, Title, Phone, Email)*
 - Physical/Mailing (Address, City, State, Zip)*
 - Damaged Facility Information (Name, Location, Primary Purpose, Critical (Y/N), Facility Fee (Y/N), In Use (Y/N), Damaged (Y/N), Owned/Legally Responsibility of Applicant (Y/N), Insured (Y/N), Additional Comments)*
 - After all necessary information has been collected, the Recipient will create an account for the Applicant in Grants Portal and submit a Request for Public Assistance (RPA) on their behalf.**
 - The Recipient's set-up actions will prompt a system-generated email to the Applicant with a username and temporary password. The Applicant will use this to log-in to Grants Portal for the first time. The user will then be prompted to set up a permanent password for their account.**
- Navigation: Follow instructions and links provided by email*
- With a valid username and password, the Applicant now has access to Grants Portal and the ability to view RPA status.**

Grants Portal
System used by State/Local/Tribal/Territorial governments and eligible non-profit organizations to manage PA grant applications.
