MAEA is excited to announce our upcoming Youth Art Month(YAM) activities! YAM encourages support for quality school art programs and promotes art material safety. The program provides unique opportunities for recognizing the skills developed through Visual Arts experiences, including critical-thinking, creativity, observation, and communication. Youth Art Month is an opportunity to share the importance of Arts education with our state. This year, we are hosting statewide contests including a flag design contest and a short-form video contest.

Flag Design Contest: The 2022 YAM theme is "Art Connects Us", and the contest is open to all K-12 students. Using the template linked below, students should create an original flag design based on the theme "Art Connects Us." The design should also include the words "Youth Art Month" and the name or image of Mississippi. Photos or scanned images of the final designs and release forms should be emailed to Ibryant@laurelschools.org by January 24, 2022.

Prizes will be awarded to each category: Overall Winner, Elementary, Middle School, and High School. Donations will also be made to the winning art programs. Short Form Video Contest: Students and teachers can submit 7, 15, or 30 second videos describing how important art education is to you. Videos will be due by March 11, 2022. The videos will be featured at the Arts Day at the Capitol as well as distributed throughout the state to support arts education.
