MONTHLY T.I.P. (THEORY IN PRACTICE)

In August, we launched a state-wide initiative focused on "Mental Health". The month of September is National Suicide Prevention month, a time when we focus on our role in suicide prevention. It is important to prevent suicide throughout the year, but during Suicide Prevention Month, school counselors are able to emphasize how important it is to reduce the stigma associated with seeking help, discuss suicidal thoughts, and identify resources that can assist.

In the midst of the pandemic and other external stresses, mental health is among students' top concerns. The suicide rate in the United States and Mississippi is steadily on the rise, and suicide prevention is a critical component of school counseling.

Throughout September and the rest of the year, I would like you to reflect on the following about your practice and counseling program. What are you doing within the counseling program to promote awareness and prevention? Who are the at-risk students? What methods are used to identify students?

When it comes to the social, emotional, and mental distress of students, school counselors are on the front line. To achieve the ethical obligation to protect students, school counselors must maintain current training in:

- Being informed about the signs of suicidal thoughts
- Being knowledgeable about the resources available
- Preparing students, staff, colleagues and parents to recognize warning symptoms for suicidal behavior
- Referring students who demonstrate signs of suicidal thoughts to local community agencies - Dr. Chancey Fort, P-LPC, SB-RPT, State Director of Counseling and Support Services PK-12
